#### **UKFC WELCOMES NEW VICE CHAIR**

## **EMPOWERING THE VOICE OF FIRE CADETS**

Fire Cadets in Derbyshire were elected by their fellow cadets to represent them on a new Youth Council for Derbyshire FRS. Two young people from each cadet unit initiated the group by attending a weekend residential aimed at teambuilding, developing their leadership skills and understanding their responsibilities and roles as a Youth Councillor.

They elected a Chair and Vice Chair, and laid out their plans for the up and coming year. Station Manager Mick Wyldbore-Wood said *"Our young people were initially overwhelmed by the scale of Derbyshire Fire and Rescue Service, but this was overcome by gradually increasing their level of responsibility. They have already achieved several tasks around provision of uniform and the structure of cadets . I am really proud and genuinely excited about young people influencing the work of DFRS, and we have already had enquiries from SLT about integrating the Youth Council into elements of our wider meeting structure. I think the future of the Youth Council is going to be one to watch!"*

## REMEMBERANCE

### THE CENOTAPH 2021

Last year, Fire Cadets from across the UK attended the Remembrance Parade at the Cenotaph in London to honour those who lost their lives whilst serving and defending our democratic freedoms and way of life.

The UKFC were honoured to be able to unite across faiths, cultures and backgrounds to commemorate the service and sacrifice of the Armed Forces community from Britain and the Commonwealth.



They marched alongside soldiers, sailors, Air Force Personnel, members of the emergency services and civilians, as well as the families of those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice and surviving service personel at the Cenotaph in London.

This year they will be repeating this momentous occasion, representing Firefighters and Fire Cadets across the UK. They will have the opportunity to congregate prior to the parade at an overnight residential at the Army Cadet Training Centre at Frimley Park.

We have been working with Online Youth Manager to develop a National data management tool called Fire Cadet Manager (FCM). FCM supports units to plan and record important data such as attendance and programme planning.

This easy to use platform enables instructors to download and monitor cadet award development, communicate with colleagues and parents, plan events, safing time that they can reinvest directly with Cadets.



## **UKRO FIRE CADET CASUATY CARE CHALLENGE 2022**

Fire Cadet teams from Derbyshire, Northamptonshire, Tyne & Wear, South Wales and the hosts - West Midlands Fire Service, participated at this years UKRO Event in a **Cadet Trauma Care Challenge** in Birmingham. They demonstrated their life saving skills and knowledge in two challenges alongside operational firefighters in this national event held on the 1st of October.

It was an amazing day, and an experience that they will never forget. The Fire Cadets were invited to the closing ceremony, where West Midlands won 1st place. Runners up were Northamptonshire Fire Cadets, with Derbyshire Fire Cadets achieving 3rd place.

At the presentation event, the Chair of UKFC Colette Black said, "*Fire Cadets, thank you for your preparation ahead of today, your preparation absolutely paid off. You showed skills, competence, resilience, you adapted and overcame the challenges that were placed in front of you, so well done ...... we are very proud of you.*"
